

# SUFFOLK AND NORTH EAST ESSEX

## HAVING YOUR SECOND COVID-19 VACCINATION

The NHS in Suffolk and north east Essex wants to make sure residents know what to do when it's time for their second dose of the vaccine

For long lasting protection, you need to have both doses of the vaccine. It's important that the same vaccine is used for both doses and it will help if you return to the same place as where you had your first dose. The information below summarises where you should go for your second dose.

### Where did you receive your first dose?

#### GP OR PRIMARY CARE NETWORK



You should return to your GP practice or the site run by your GP / Primary Care Network for your second dose.

Your GP may have already given you a date for your second dose.

If you don't have a date yet, your GP will contact you soon with a date.

#### LARGE VACCINATION CENTRE



You should have already been given a date to return to a vaccination centre for your second dose.

If you don't have a date yet, you can book one [online using the COVID-19 National Booking Service System](#) or by calling 119.

If you live in Suffolk and north east Essex and need help to book an appointment you can ring 0344 2573 961.

#### A LOCAL HOSPITAL



If you had your first dose of the vaccine at either Ipswich, Colchester or West Suffolk Hospital, then you must have your second dose there. You should have been given a date for your second dose appointment when you attended for your first vaccination.

#### A COMMUNITY PHARMACY



You should have already been given a date to return to a community pharmacy for your second dose.
